# **Census of Restricted Regime Prisoners October 2014**

The Irish Prison Service Statistics Unit commenced the collation of a quarterly Census of Restricted Regime Prisoners in 2013 with surveys conducted in July and October. Three census surveys have now been carried out in 2014 with the most recent on 1 October 2014.

The result of the October 2014 Census shows that the number of prisoners on restricted regimes has reduced slightly in the overall figure compared to July 2014. Figures show that there has been a decrease from 269 (July 14) to **257** (October 14), a decrease of **12** or **4.4%**.

# The number of prisoners on a restricted regime has decreased by 82 or 24% since the introduction of these surveys in July 2013.

The figure for those on a restricted regime for protection reasons (Rule 63) was 241, (of which 230 were there at their own request).

The number of prisoners on **22 and 23 hour lock up** was **52** (**23hr** – **51, 22hr 1**) which represents an increase of 10 on July 2014. <u>Since the commencement of the</u> <u>Census in July 2013, the number of prisoners on 22/23 hour lock up has decreased</u> <u>by 159 or 75% from 211 to 52.</u>

# **Key Statistics**

- Of the 933 prisoners classified as protection prisoners only 241 had regime restricted.
- 257 prisoners in total were subject to a restricted regime
- 241 (6% of prison population 3,806) prisoners on protection (Rule 63), of which 230 were there of their own request.
- 16 prisoners restricted on grounds of order (Rule 62)
- No prisoners were restricted due to discipline (Rule 67, Part 3 Prisons Act 2007).

The restriction of a prisoner's regime can occur due to a number of factors including, the protection of vulnerable prisoners. This is provided for under Rule 63 of the Prison Rules 2007. A prisoner may, either at his/her own request or when the Governor considers it necessary, in so far as is practicable and subject to the maintenance and good order and safe and secure custody, be kept separate from other prisoners who are reasonably likely to cause significant harm to him/her.

The fact that prisoners seeking protection are immediately separated from the general population or from specific prisoners identified as presenting a threat, clearly demonstrates the commitment of the Irish Prison Service to ensure their

safety and security. The status of each prisoner on restricted regime within the prison system is regularly reviewed. If possible, prisoners can be transferred to other institutions where a restricted regime would not be necessary.

In addition, the Governor may decide, for the maintenance of good order in the prison, to remove a prisoner from general association or structured activity to reduce the negative effect that a prisoner or prisoners may have on the general population. This is provided for under Rule 62 of the Prison Rules 2007. There may also be a smaller number of prisoners who would be restricted for medical (Rule 64) or discipline reasons (Rule 67).

In July last year, the Director General of the Irish Prison Service established a high level group to look at measures which can be introduced to reduce the number of prisoners currently held on restricted regimes with a view to ensuring that all receive, as a minimum standard, out of cell time of 3 hours per day, to engage in exercise or activity.
