Q&A on Positive Covid-19 cases in Irish Prisons

The Irish Prison Service is currently managing an outbreak of Covid-19 in Cloverhill and the Midlands Prisons.

This news may be a cause for concern especially if you have a family member or friend currently imprisoned in one of these prisons. The Irish Prison Service would like to reassure you that we are doing everything we can to stop the spread of the virus within the prisons.

I am sure you may have questions about the health and safety of your loved ones. We will try to answer some of those questions below.

How will I know if my loved one has Covid-19?

If you have a family member who has been confirmed as positive for Covid-19, and you are registered as their next of kin, you will have been contacted. Prisoners who test positive are offered the opportunity to speak with their family members themselves. If necessary, our staff will contact families if any cases arise. There is no need to ring the prison to find out if someone has Covid-19, you will be contacted.

Are there cases of Covid-19 all over the prison?

The Prison Service is working closely with Public Health, HSE with regard to the management of the current outbreaks including making arrangements for the mass testing of staff and prisoners if required. This is necessary and is required to be completed in order to identify if there are any further cases. Testing is currently ongoing.

Will I still be able to have my phone calls?

Yes, due to the positives cases, we have to make some changes to the prison regime but we realise how important family contact is. Phone calls will continue as normal if possible however, there may be some restrictions with regard to prisoners in precautionary isolation but we are trying to ensure that they continue to have access to a telephone.

Will prisoners still be able to access services such as drug counsellors or psychology?

Normally yes, but similar to communities the services are currently reduced and will return when it is safe to do so. Psychology support is available over the phone, as is addiction support through Merchant's Quay Ireland counsellors who will also operate a phone support service.

Can prisoners still go to school or work and training?

Prisoner that are confined to their cells have access to quality assured learning materials and an in-cell TV channel which is being used to provide educational content created by the prison teachers. Prisoners involved in essential work and training activities will still be able to participate. We hope to return to a more normal regime after everyone has been tested for the second time.

Will they be restricted to their rooms all day with nothing to do?

We will be allowing people out their rooms for exercises. We have also provided Netflix and this will provide some entertainment in the evening.

Can I still put money into their shop account?

Yes, through the usual methods. Prisoners will have access to Tuckshop facilities.

What happens if they fall ill from Covid-19 and need to see a doctor or nurse?

As you probably know, we have an excellent healthcare team on site in our prisons and if anyone needs medical support our staff will be available. We will be monitoring anyone who tested positive regularly and we assure you we will provide them with excellent care if they are unwell.

Do you have enough PPE and hand sanitizer to allow people to keep safe?

We have been preparing for Covid-19 since January 2020 and the Prison Service has purchased large stocks of PPE and hand sanitizer.
